7:30 am - Building opens and entries will be taken

8:45 am - Entries closed except those who have notified the show secretary they shall be late

9:00 am - Shows begin

Show Rules

1. All ARBA classes may be entered and shown.
2. The show management will eliminate and bar from the show any animals not earmarked properly, not in good health, or showing any signs of illness.
3. SRR&CC & MVRBA reserve the right to refuse any entry.
4. Each exhibitor is responsible for getting their own animals to and from the show table promptly.
5. There is to be no interference with the judge's placement of any animal, no talking across the table to the judge by the exhibitor, unless the judge so directs. If there is any interference, the exhibitor shall be asked to leave and shall forfeit their entry fees.
6. This is a one day solid bottom carry cage show.
7. SRR&CC, MVRBA or show facilitators will not be held responsible for loss due to fire, theft, accident or destruction. All precautions, within reason, will be taken.
8. MVRBA & SRR&CC reserve the right to substitute judges, to interpret and enforce these show rules, and all ARBA rules.
9. By filling out and signing the entry form, the exhibitor agrees to abide by these show rules, and all ARBA rules.
10. Each exhibitor who sends telephone and/or e-mail entries must verify their entries prior to the show starting.
11. All entries must be submitted and/or verified with the respective show secretaries by 8:45 AM, unless given specific exemptions by prior coordination.

12. ***No dogs in allowed the showroom. Thank you.**
13. Do not set up in the middle of the showroom until all show tables are in place.
14. ***Attention All Parents: All children must be supervised at all times during the show. Please do not let your children run unattended as their has been problems in the past. We appreciate your cooperation.**

Directions to the Minidoka Fairgrounds:

Exit either of the two I-84 exits to Rupert and follow the signs toward town.

From the east exit, turn in to the fairgrounds just prior to the canal.

From the west exit, proceed to and through Rupert, and immediately after the canal east of town, turn into the fairgrounds.

The show building is the last of three green metal buildings with entrances front and rear

NOTE: Do not leave your vehicles parked on the road at the east side of the building, or it may be ticketed or struck.

NOTE: Do not park beside the back of the building south of the overhead door, as that is a fire lane. Both these areas may be used for loading and unloading only.

Motels: there are several nice motels just off the west exit off I-84 to Burley. There are restaurants both in Burley and Rupert.

Upon arrival, unload your vehicles, and move them to parking either behind or beside the buildings.

Set up your animals in the smallest space possible, as there will be congestion in the showroom. Leave aisles, and be flexible.

ARBA 2010 YOUTH ROYALTY CONTEST

PURPOSE

To acknowledge excellence among A.R.B.A. youth members in attendance at the ARBA National Convention and Show. To allow these members to demonstrate a working knowledge of the rabbit and cavy industry. To explore critical thinking skills, demonstrate personal initiative and provide problem-solving, decision-making and goal-setting activities for these youth members.

A GOOD APPLICATION

You have to decide how you want to present your project and yourself, but all winning applications have some things in common:

1. Make sure you answer the question asked! You can talk about other things as well, but the most common error is not answering the question asked.
2. Pictures tell a lot about you and your project. Select them carefully and size them appropriately to tell the story. Include captions so the judges know what they are looking at and why.
3. Using good grammar and spelling tells the judge you are serious and careful. Ask a teacher to proofread your application.

RULES

1. Any ARBA youth member is eligible to compete. Membership must be valid on September 1st. Attendance at the ARBA National Convention is not necessary.
2. Applications are to be composed and completed by the contestant.
3. Up to five pages and less than 4500 words, printed on one side only, may be submitted by the applicant.
4. Include your name and ARBA membership number at the top of each page of information submitted.
5. The sum of the scores from the application, written test, interview, identification, and judging contests will determine the winners. All 5 areas will have equal weight for scoring point totals.
6. Enclose a photo of yourself with this application! On the back of the photo write your Royalty age group, name, city, and state. Send photos sized no larger than 3 x 3 inches. This photo is part of your application and will be used in *Domestic Rabbits* and in the *ARBA Yearbook* if you are a Royalty winner. The best photo would be head and shoulders or waist up. You may be with your animal, but remember that you are the center of attention.
7. Enter online or send your **Contest Entry Form** and THREE copies of your answers!

Applications must be online or postmarked by September 1, 2010

Applications online or postmarked between Sept. 2-7, 2010 will receive a 20 point deduction

CONVENTION DATES & PROCEDURES

Nov. 7: Each contestant in the King, Queen, Duke, Duchess, Prince, and Princess division will judge 4 classes of 4 animals per class. This is a timed event of 7 minutes per class. Placements will be made on special forms provided. The use of the *ARBA STANDARD OF PERFECTION* at the judging table is encouraged. The use of judging aids or placing markers should be of very minimal size.

Nov 7: Each Royalty contestant will compete in a breed identification contest. Contestant will be required to identify 25 animals, both rabbits and cavies, listing the complete breed name as printed in the *ARBA STANDARD OF PERFECTION*. They will also identify the showroom variety, whether a 4 class or 6 class breed, and the registration variety of each of the 25 animals. No abbreviations are accepted.

Nov 8: All contestants will take a written test at the convention. The questions for this test will be taken from the *ARBA Official Guidebook*, the *ARBA Yearbook*, the *ARBA Standard of Perfection*, the *ARBA Domestic Rabbit Guide*, issues of *Domestic Rabbits* from Jan/Feb, 2009 to present, and the ARBA Web Site. Lord and Lady contestants will be provided help in reading their test. Test answers will be recorded on scan "bubble sheets". Utmost care will be needed to assure the correct recording of answers for accurate scoring.

Nov 9: Top point contestants will be interviewed at the convention, interview times will be posted after 4 p.m. Nov 8. Contestants for interviews should be in proper showroom attire with a show coat, apron with long sleeved shirt or, at minimum, a long sleeve white shirt.

Nov. 10: Attend the ARBA Youth Awards Banquet. Most contestants wear dress clothes.

A complete application will include:

1. A completed **Contest Entry Form**, including your signature and your parent/ guardian's signature.
2. Three (3) copies of your answers. Question 16 will be printed in *Domestic Rabbits* if you are a winner. Everyone will read it so make it a good reflection of what you wish to say.
3. One photograph of you with your Royalty age division, name, residence city and state printed on the back. The photograph will be published in *Domestic Rabbits* and the *ARBA Yearbook* if you are a winner.

Deductions— Each application rule not followed will result in a 10 point deductions (i.e. failure to send picture, failure to follow word/page limit). Late applications will receive a 20 point deduction.

ARBA 2010 ROYALTY APPLICATION

There are two ways to enter this contest, on-line or by mail. Please enter on-line if possible, it reduces errors and saves a lot of paper.

On-line entry:

Copy and answer the 16 questions in Microsoft word. Photographs and graphics may be included. Save the final copy as a .pdf if possible. Do not exceed 4500 words or 5 pages.

Go to the on-line entry form, fill out the form and upload your final copy where it says royalty. The uploaded copies need to be less than 1MB and in .pdf or .doc format. Upload your photograph at the same time where it says "photograph".

Mail entry:

Copy and answer the 16 questions, photographs and graphics may be included. The final copy should be typed. Do not exceed 4500 words or 5 pages. Send in THREE copies.

Print the entry form, fill it out and send it along with your application. Include all contests you are entering in one envelope and you only need one entry form for everything.

Use 10 point Arial or Times New Roman fonts with min. margins of 1/2 inch.

Include your name and ARBA membership number at the top of each page.

Questions:

1. When did you join the ARBA and how many consecutive years have you belonged?
2. How and when did you get started in your project? Include names of those who have helped you the most.
3. Name the breed(s) you raise and how many animals you have in each breed. Include breed(s) you have raised in the past and why you no longer raise them.
4. List your memberships in rabbit &/or cavy related organizations. Include the name of each club (no abbreviations) and the number of years you have been a member.
5. What offices or committees have you served on in local, state, or national rabbit or cavy clubs?
6. What have you done to promote your breed(s) and make others aware of your project?
7. How have you been a leader in your project?
8. Describe the housing & equipment for your animals, be very specific.
9. What specifically do you do to help with the care and upkeep of your project?
10. Describe the records you keep and how you keep them.
11. List outstanding awards and achievements your animals have earned.
12. List outstanding awards and achievements you have earned in this project.
13. What are your goals for this project?
14. How do you feel your project will help you in your future endeavors?
15. What would you like us to know that has not been asked?
16. ****If you win this award, a short description of your achievements will be printed in *Domestic Rabbits*. Write what you would like to be printed in 300 to 600 words.** This is a separate page and does not count toward the word count or the 5 page total.**
